


Figure 5 August 2011

Question 5.0: If you were asked to vote on a <u>SUPER Mayor Model</u>, would you be inclined to vote YES or NO?




Figure 6 August 2011




Figure 7 August 2011

Support or Oppose Making City Elections NON-PARTISAN




Figure 8 August 2011






Figure 9 August 2011







Figure 11 August 2011
