2017 STATE PARTY RULES AMENDMENTS

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(Note: All rule changes submitted to the State Party Chairman must be submitted to the State Convention as presented. Any duplication of submissions is the result of counties submitting similar changes.)

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OKGOP Rules may be amended in the following manner according to existing OKGOP State Party Rules.

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OKGOP Rule 20 (e)

Amendment of Rules by State Convention: These rules may be amended and changed by a majority vote of any State Convention by either of the following methods: (1) Amendment must first be submitted to the State Executive Committee, which shall, with or without recommendation, include a copy of the proposed change in the Call authorized in Rule 16 (c); (2) Amendment proposed by a vote of a County or Congressional District Convention shall be submitted to a vote at the next succeeding State Convention if filed with the State Chairman within five (5) days after adjournment of said County or Congressional District Convention. Notice of amendments proposed by a County or Congressional District Convention shall be given by the State Chairman by written or electronic notice to the Chairman of each County delegation, or if no other delegation chairman has been designated, to the County Chairman, at least ten (10) days prior to said State Convention. Any failure of a state convention to take due parliamentary action on a county's or district's proposed amendment at the state convention shall result in the same amendment being first order of business at the next state convention. Any failure by any county, district, or state leader to present an amendment passed by a county or district convention shall be deemed a Rule 3(a) violation of a sacred and inviolate right of party participation.

SUBMITTED BY McCLAIN COUNTY

PROPOSED RULE CHANGE #2

SUBMITTED BY McCLAIN COUNTY

- The purpose of the motion is to amend the Rules of the Oklahoma Republican Party to add an additional item to Rule 17(d) to allow the Convention Rules Committee to recommend adoption or non-adoption of changes to the State Party Rules.
- Proposed OKGOP Rule Change. Rule 17(d) State Convention Rules Committee. Item 7 shall be added as follows:
- 7. The Rules Committee report shall address each proposed rule change and give reasons for adoption or non-adoption.

PROPOSED RULE CHANGE #3

SUBMITTED BY CARTER COUNTY

- The true action taken in every Precinct in Oklahoma will be the selection of the State and District Committee people and is no distinguishing gender associated with the election of one of these people. Therefore, our desire is to correct the Rules and Regulations at our State Convention.
- We request a change in all Rules in Section 6 and 7 and any other Rules where the identification reads "Committeeman or Committeewoman to be changed to **COMMITTEE PERSON**.

PROPOSED RULE CHANGE #4

76 SUBMITTED BY CIMARRON COUNTY

Removing Gender Restrictions in State Committee & District Committee

Purpose: to amend the Rules of the Oklahoma Republican Party to remove gender restrictions for district committee and state committee members, and clarify additional language.

Reasons:

- 1. The Oklahoma Republican Party platform approved in 2015 states, "The Oklahoma Republican Party believes in equal rights and opportunities for all. Therefore, we believe 'affirmative action' is more harmful than beneficial."
- 2. The Republican National Committee platform approved in 2016 states "Merit and hard work should determine advancement in our society, so we reject unfair preferences, quotas, and set- asides as forms of discrimination."
- 3. The Republican Party has always stood for electing or choosing individuals based on their merit, and not by race, gender, religion, or any other distinction.
- 4. We should bring the Party Rules in line with the Party Platforms, and achieve maximum participation in the Party at all levels.
- 5. In 2011, State Convention delegates overwhelmingly voted to remove gender restrictions on precinct, county, district and state chairs and vice-chairs.

PROPOSED RULE CHANGE #5

SUBMITTED BY CANADIAN COUNTY

This amendment to the rules supports platform change number 2 above and gives the party a structure that it can follow for examining candidates. The candidates eligible for examination by the State Party are limited to Federal and Statewide offices in the interest of relevance and in order to allow county organizations to examine and endorse lower-level candidates without the concern of state party influence overriding their voices.

1. A proposed amendment to the Rules of the Oklahoma Republican Party, to be added as a new rule, titled *Examining Candidates for Elected Offices*.

a. The Oklahoma Republican Party State Chairman, in the interest of informing the voting public during primary elections and special elections, shall request Republican candidates for President of the United States of America and Oklahoma's statewide and federal congressional elected offices to affirm which sections of the Platform of the Oklahoma Republican Party they support. This request shall be made to official candidates within ten (10) business days of the filing deadline for these offices. The deadline for candidate response is ten (10) business days from the date of the Chairman's request. This request and responses to it may be made in written, typed, or electronic form. The Platform shall be made available to the candidates in the request.

The State Chairman shall make public the candidates' responses, or failure to respond, on the Oklahoma Republican Party's website and to the press within ten (10) business days of the request deadline. The Oklahoma statewide-elected offices are Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Auditor and Inspector, Attorney General, State Treasurer, Superintendent of Public Instruction, Commissioner of Labor, Commissioner of Insurance, and Corporation Commissioner. The Oklahoma federal congressional elected offices are United States Congressman and United States Senator.

 In the event that county parties conduct candidate examinations, the results of such examinations shall be delivered to the State Chairman, and the Chairman shall make public such results on the Oklahoma Republican Party's website within ten (10) business days of receiving the results.

In the event of refusal or failure of the Oklahoma Republican Party State Chairman to adhere to this rule and to discharge the obligations under this rule, any member of the Oklahoma Republican Party State Committee may call the Chairman to act and may call for a meeting of the State Committee to implement appropriate action. Refer to Rule 10.c. of the Rules of the Oklahoma Republican Party for information regarding calling a meeting of the State Committee.

*The purpose of this rule change is to create a simple means of judging candidate's support of the Oklahoma Republican Party Platform. This will aid a voter's decision in races. The intention of the request is to ask a candidate to initial each point of the platform with which he or she agrees. This will provide a good measure of a candidates values. This is not an endorsement, but a simple report of a candidate's support of the OKGOP platform, in order to better inform voters.

 The purpose of this Motion is to amend the Rules of the Oklahoma Republican Party by adding a new Section (i) under Rule 19., General Rules Applicable to Various Officers and Committees, which would require candidates to disclose whether their positions on issues agree with those of our Republican Platform.

If this Motion is passed, the new rule proposed hereby will be submitted to the 2017 Oklahoma Republican State Convention pursuant to state party Rule 20. (e) (2). It is important that this Motion be passed and the new rule adopted because:

- 1891. Republican Party activists are asked by candidates for their support, time, work, money and vote, 190 and they deserve to know sooner rather than later whether those candidates agree with the 191 official positions of the Party as expressed by our Platform.
- 1922. This motion does not propose a "litmus test" for candidates. They need not agree with one plank 193 in our Platform in order to receive the endorsement and support of our Party. They must simply 194 disclose where they stand on the issues.

PROPOSED RULE CHANGE #6

SUBMITTED BY CIMARRON COUNTY

Rule 19.(i) Disclosure of Agreement of Candidates with Our Platform: For a Republican candidate for elective office to receive the endorsement and support of the Oklahoma Republican Party, he must read and mark up a copy of the current Oklahoma Republican Platform, indicating his agreement or disagreement with each plank with explanation as necessary, and make it available for review at the state Party office.

PROPOSED RULE CHANGE #7

SUBMITTED BY WOODWARD COUNTY

Rule 19

(c) Proxies: Absent members of any County Committee, Congressional District Committee, or State Committee meeting, or any other official committee meeting, may be represented at such meeting by a written proxy designating the person who is to represent the member, except that there shall be no proxies at any convention or precinct meeting. Any person carrying a proxy must possess the same residence qualifications as the member represented, and if so, shall have the same rights and privileges as a- the voting member represented as shown by the following: and is qualified in the manner shown in the following PROXY CHART:

(d) No person shall carry more than seven (7) proxies to any meeting. Proxies shall be recognized or considered valid only for the designated meeting. Any proxy may be revoked at any time by the person who gave it, but a proxy may not be transferred to another person by the person carrying the proxy. The use of proxies or proxy voting is hereby prohibited at all precinct meetings and all conventions of the Oklahoma Republican Party. Incomplete proxies shall not be valid.
